

Bishop Frank Anthone White – Short Biography

Frank Anthone White is a third-generation servant in the Church of God in Christ, with more than 50 years of dedicated ministry. The eldest son of the late Bishop Frank Otha White and Dr. Juliet L. White, his service has spanned from Sunday School Instructor and Minister of Music to Pastor and national leadership.

He serves as Pastor of Zion Cathedral, where he leads a dynamic and growing congregation supported by over 45 ministries focused on holistic development. In addition, as CEO of Cedarmore Corporation, he oversees impactful youth initiatives centered on education, empowerment, and community engagement across the New York metropolitan area.

Bishop White's academic background includes studies at Five Towns College, Long Island University, and the MKWW Religious Training Institute. His influence extends globally through preaching, teaching, and lecturing at institutions such as Cornell University and Queens College, as well as ministry engagements at major venues including Madison Square Garden.

In 2017, he was appointed Jurisdictional Prelate of the New York Eastern Third Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and later elected to the General Board of the Church of God in Christ. In 2023, he was appointed by Governor Kathy Hochul to the New York State Interfaith Advisory Council.

A published author of *Zero Tolerance* (2019) and *Trust: The Currency of the Kingdom* (2024), Bishop White continues to impact the body of Christ through visionary leadership, sound doctrine, and community advancement. He is supported by his son, Pastor J. K. White, his daughter-in-love, and grandson, Jeremiah.
